

## Claire McCall - Material List

- 2 x 16" x 12" primed canvas board or stretched canvas or gessoed board

Paint: I recommend Winsor & Newton water mixable oil or you can choose a similar brand but colours may differ. You may use traditional oils but be wary that we go through a fair amount of paint with a thicker application. Acrylics are also an option, however it might be necessary to add an impasto medium depending on the viscosity of the particular brand you use.

Within the Winsor & Newton water mixable, I recommend the following colours in this range:

- Titanium White
- Prussian Blue
- Alizarin Crimson
- Yellow Ochre
- Burnt Sienna

I use 200ml tubes for the colours listed above however for this class the 37ml tubes will be adequate.

- Cad Red medium
- Viridian Green or Phthalo Green Blue Shade
- Ultramarine Blue
- Cad Yellow Light

I use 37ml tubes for the colours above as these are used less often and are used in small quantities. If attending with a friend, consider sharing.

- Medium - water mixable linseed oil (optional) or appropriate medium according to type of paint used.
- Palette - disposable pad or traditional palette according to student preference
- Rags and wet wipes
- Mechanical pencil
- Fine brush for line drawing
- Large brush for painting ground colour on canvas.
- I use a muted red and yellow acrylic paint if preparing the canvas on the day or Burnt Sienna in water-mixable oil can be used if the canvas is prepared a few days in advance of the workshop and allowed to dry.
- Palette knives - I use mainly diamond head shaped knives in various sizes and a more rounded blade for backgrounds. Each brand has different numbering systems so it's difficult to name the size. I have attached an image with the shapes I use circled. A small to medium version of each would be adequate for the workshop.
